These five actor voice games will help your story-telling abilities, get your brain used to timing without rushing and remind you to warm up your Vocal articulators – if you can't speak clearly, we're never going to hear you...

If you do nothing else for your voice than warm up with humming and the Tongue Twister exercises, you must do these to kick start your voice before presenting.
